# From tee to pink

MT OMMANEY'S McLeod Country Golf Club is throwing its support behind Breast Cancer Awareness month after a club member recently lost her fight to the disease.

The club's Pink Ribbon Day on October 7 attracted a field of 115 women who all wore pink.

Participants on the day helped raise \$1870 for the National Breast Cancer

Association.

Club president Deborah Marsland said the fundraisers held a special place for club members after losing one of their own to breast cancer.

Former member Lisa Orhart, 29, died in early September, leaving behind a husband and two children.

Mrs Marsland said the club raised more than \$1000 at a Pink and Pearls Day

held in memory of Mrs. Orhart on September 26.

"We gave the proceeds to the McGrath Foundation, Lisa's preferred charity," Mrs Marsland said.

"Many of us know of someone, or have been close to someone, who lost a loved one to breast cancer, and the club has lost two members to breast cancer in the last few years."
